J49.1 Security Requirements**J49.1.1 Compliance With Activity Security Requirements**

The contractor shall comply with all activity security requirements. The contractor shall submit the name and address of each employee hired for work under this contract as an employee of the contractor, and shall cause to be filled out, questionnaires and other forms as may be necessary for the completion of background investigations, referred to as Trustworthiness National Agency Checks (NAC) under the Department of the Navy's Facility Access Determination program. The contractor shall verify and ensure that all employees hired for work under this contract are U.S. citizens. Additionally, the contractor will verify and ensure that no employee hired for work under this contract, full or part time, including employees of its subcontractors, has been convicted of a felony within the judicial system. If upon completion and review of the trustworthiness NAC, the Government makes an unfavorable suitability determination with respect to any individual, the contractor will be so notified of the nonacceptance of the individual for work under the contract. Suitability determination decisions of the government are final and not subject to appeal. In the event questionable behavior or criminal acts are exhibited by contractor employees, the government reserves the right to deny access to this facility. This decision is final and not subject to appeal.

J49.1.2 Security Office

All contractor employees shall obtain government-issued contractor badges and vehicle passes from the Security Office. The contractor will provide the Security Office with all required paperwork necessary for issuing its employees, including any subcontractors, the required badges and vehicle passes. All contract employees, while working onboard the Coastal Systems Station, will have the government-issued badge displayed. The prime contractor is responsible for badge accountability, including those issued to subcontractors. Upon expiration of the contract, all employees' badges and vehicle passes shall be returned to the Station Security Office within 10 working days. Badges and vehicle passes issued to contract employees shall not negate the requirement for employee identification required in the "IDENTIFICATION OF CONTRACTOR EMPLOYEES".

J49.1.3 Employees

All contractor/subcontractor employees working under this contract shall be identified by a distinctive name plate, emblem, or patch attached in a prominent place on an outer garment. Employee identification shall not be substituted for station required passes or badges.

J49.1.3.1

The contractor shall provide to the Security Office the name or names of the responsible supervisory person or persons authorized to act for the contractor.

J49.1.3.1

Contractor employees shall conduct themselves in a proper, efficient, courteous and businesslike manner.

J49.1.3.1

The Contractor shall remove from the site any individual whose continued employment is deemed by the Security Office to be contrary to the public interest or inconsistent with the best interest of National Security.

J49.1.3.1

No employee or representative of the Contractor will be admitted to the site of work unless he/she furnishes satisfactory proof that he/she is a Citizen of the United States, or, if an alien, his residence within the United States is legal.

J49.1.4 Vehicle Identification

Each Contractor provided vehicle shall show the Contractor's name on the vehicle front door so that it is clearly visible and shall at all times, display a valid state license plate and safety inspection sticker, if applicable. Contractor vehicles operated on Government property shall be maintained in good repair.
